

Places of Welcome - Norley 'Open Door Community Café'

The Norley 'Open Door Community Café' is a community space operating within the 'Places of Welcome' (<u>www.placesofwelcome.org.uk</u>) network, serving the community of Norley and the surrounding area, based at Norley Methodist Church (<u>www.norleymethodistchurch.org.uk</u>).



As the name implies, it is an **accessible** and **hospitable** place, open at the same time each week (Tuesday's 9am – 12 noon).

We offer **refreshments** (tea/coffee, cake and biscuits, soft drinks for youngsters), which are free (donations are welcome), with conversation, and companionship.

The Open Door Café is staffed by volunteers, and **all are welcome** regardless of circumstances or situation. We encourage participation and **belonging** as every person has talents, experiences and skills to share. Come with your friends or come on your own – we're here with no other agenda than to welcome you!

Set in the historic surroundings of the old Sunday School Room, the 'Open Door Community Café' offers a bright, warm and welcoming atmosphere with more than a nod to its 19th cent roots. 'Old Norley' is prominently portrayed with historic images of 'past times with good company'.

As a place for everyone, the facilities are push-chair and wheel-chair friendly with disabled parking on-site, regular parking outside on Maddocks Hill, and overflow parking at Norley Village Hall – making the Open Door Community Café convenient for Village Hall users, and it is within easy walking distance from our wonderful village primary school.
